An Opening sentence from the Book of Common Prayer

To the Lord our God belong mercies and forgiveness, though we have rebelled against him: neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his laws which he set before us

Dearlly beloved, the Scripture moveth us in sundry places to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloke them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by his infinite goodness and mercy. And although we ought at all times humbly to acknowledge our sins before God; yet ought we most chiefly so to do, when we assemble and meet together to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul. Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are gathered, to accompany me with a pure heart and humble voice unto the throne of the heavenly grace, saying after me:

Almighty and most merciful Father, We have erred, and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, We have offended against thy holy laws, We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, And we have done those things which we ought not to have done, And there is no health in us: But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us miserable offenders; Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults, Restore thou them that are penitent, According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord: And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. **Amen.**

First reading (Old Testament) - I Kings 10: 1-7,9

When the queen of Sheba heard about the fame of Solomon and his relationship to the Lord, she came to test Solomon with hard questions. ² Arriving at Jerusalem with a very great caravan—with camels carrying spices, large quantities of gold, and precious stones—she came to Solomon and talked with him about all that she had on her mind. ³ Solomon answered all her questions; nothing was too hard for the king to explain to her. ⁴ When the queen of Sheba saw all the wisdom of Solomon and the palace he had built, ⁵ the food on his table, the seating of his officials, the attending servants in their robes, his cupbearers, and the burnt offerings he made at^[a] the temple of the Lord, she was overwhelmed.

⁶ She said to the king, "The report I heard in my own country about your achievements and your wisdom is true. ⁷ But I did not believe these things until I came and saw with my own eyes. Indeed, not even half was told me; in wisdom and wealth you have far exceeded the report I heard. ⁹ Praise be to the Lord your God, who has delighted in you and placed you on the throne of Israel. Because of the Lord's eternal love for Israel, he has made you king to maintain justice and righteousness."

Second reading (New Testament) - John 6: 24-38

Once the crowd realized that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into the boats and went to Capernaum in search of Jesus.

²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?"

²⁶ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. ²⁷ Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."

²⁸ Then they asked him, "What must we do, to do the works God requires?"

²⁹ Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent."

³⁰ So they asked him, "What sign then will you give that we may see it and believe you? What will you do? ³¹ Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written: 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'"

Sermon for 8th after Trinity 2 August 2020

Readings 1 Kings 10: 1-7,9 & John 6 24-38

Handel's Arrival of The Queen of Sheba is a very popular Bride's Arrival Wedding Music. Interestingly is it very ordered, mathematical in its musical structure, yet full of musicality, colour and orchestration. It's grand and regal.

Today's OT narrative of the Arrival of The Queen of Sheba at Solomon's palace indicates her wealth, status, impact, power and intellect. Solomon is her equal in intellect, but more, she notes his wisdom as well as his wealth and grandeur. She also notices in his palace a sense of order and an attitude that indicates he acknowledges something greater than himself. The Queen of Sheba witnesses, not just a self-indulgent splendour, but a management and leadership full of respect and honour. She had heard about Solomon but needed to see him for herself. And yet she does not, in this text, applaud him, but rather she applauds his creator God, the one whom he praises, thanks, respects and obeys in his own calling to lead Israel with justice and righteousness.

In our NT reading, after Jesus had fed the 5,000 from 5 loaves and 2 fishes, we hear that his audience were caught. This man Jesus, they discerned, was indeed inspiring, but is it reminiscent of The Queen of Sheba's discernment of Solomon.

Jesus was worth seeing certainly. What would he do next? But Jesus audience were like children, like those locally who have been absorbed by Tweedy the Clown of Gifford Circus, during Lockdown, streamed into many homes by the Cirencester's Barn Theatre. Tweedie is now appearing in person at the Outdoor Barn Theatre behind Theatro, which has been set up with excellent social distancing and safety rules in place. I

heard stories of excited, adoring children with their families there on Sunday afternoon. They will have laughed and clapped and been spell-bound.

But in our bible story for today, Jesus challenges this attitude from his own audience. Jesus is not just another entertainer, which is not in any way to detract from Tweedie's skill. I suspect that Tweedy also teaches kids and parents truths that are worth remembering and living by. And isn't he following his calling by using his gifts and developed skills in a productive and wholesome way?

Nevertheless Jesus, having engaged his own crowds wants them to take away, and live out his message. Following him is not to be a passing fad. He is not another stage struck 5 minute wonder passing though. Following him will demand an ongoing piece of work, a life commitment, yet they will be invigorated and sustained by his commitment to BEING their bread. Their sustenance. And yet, what does even Jesus say? That it is neither Moses nor himself who gives this bread, but rather God.

Jesus finishes this dialogue with his crowd by definitely naming himself AS the Bread of Life from God, but HIMSELF given to them by God. So we have a definitive moment in Jesus' ministry when he announces his role, his sonship, the cost for him: To Be the Bread, broken as we now know: to be the reconnection for all his followers, then and now, to God, through his own dramatic and costly life performance. Not just to pass through but to remain in the hearts, minds and guts of all who do not let him just lodge in the history books, but who sustain his entry into the annals of eternity through each and every soul who connects with him life-long, and through all periods of history and across all the world.

The Queen of Sheba, Solomon, Tweedy the Clown, you and me, can all be connected in God, through Jesus.

Seeing and hearing is believing for all of us. God identifies and seeks, through his creation, pursuance of justice, righteousness and wisdom. But I wonder whether we always look for it and see it and name it. We all need signs; we all need to see unexpected good things happening in a dark and sadly fallen world. But do we allow the blessings of our days to hold our attention at the end of each one, or do we stress on the negative and the ungodly, which is all around and all across the world.

In whom do we see and to whom do we listen in our own lives? whom we believe to be agents of God? And how do we know? By seeing Jesus' way in them? By knowing it is he who nourishes their souls, and thereby their actions, whilst understanding that it is his life story which has informed them of God.

We are surely all souls damaged by a harsh and complex world, who need a saving grace as we travel our earthly journey. I was reminded of this when watching the film Australia last week, along with my husband, son, daughter in law and three teenage grandchildren. I think it's a good watch, although they might say I'm addicted to Hugh Jackman! For others maybe it's Nicole Kidman! But I still think it's a good watch, not just for its scenery, aboriginal life in the bush, and a bit of WW2 history but because The Drover, Hugh Jackman, whose personal driver appears to be herding cattle with all the macho skill he can muster, finally realises that this driven-ness in him has actually been a distraction from letting himself become vulnerable to pain. And that he can only be redeemed by the giving and receiving of love, which will mean embracing the pain. Yet he knows that living out love instead of escaping from it, will inevitably make him susceptible to feeling again, which comes with joy and pain.

God is Love and those who live in love, live in God: Marriage service words which sometimes immediately follow the Arrival of The Queen of Sheba. Love costs. Jesus knows it. Yet in nourishing us he draws us, with him, ever closer to creating not a hell, but a heaven on earth and into eternity.
