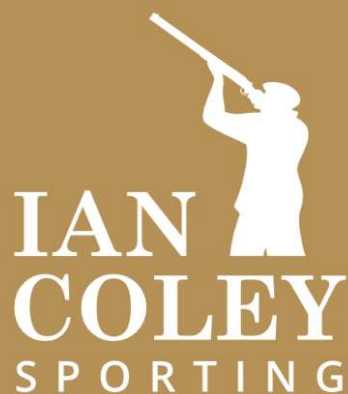

Pastoral Letter – Revd David Minns

I mentioned in last month's magazine that the season of Advent is the Church's New Year. You probably knew that anyway. Before the year can begin, we first draw a line under the year just past – for us that's in November. That year reaches its peak with Christ on His throne in heaven – 'Christ the King' Sunday. Now the New Year can begin – and it starts by looking forward to God coming to us. That's the season of Advent. Christmas celebrates the arrival of God incarnate in Jesus Christ.

For a new thing to begin, something must end. T.S Eliot wrote: "What we call the beginning is often the end. And to make an end is to make a beginning. The end is where we start from."

Endings are not to be feared, they are part of what defines something; it has a start, it has an end – it has existed for a time. A never-ending race is just exhausting and a never-ending football match pointless! An ending is the start point for something new.

Endings and beginnings are part of life – life was designed that way! The Bible opens with the words 'In the beginning, and though we haven't finished yet there is a promise from Jesus 'Behold, I am coming soon'. And the response is 'Amen. Come Lord Jesus'!

Our Churn Valley Benefice is going through some significant changes at the moment, and some of those changes are endings. This magazine is the last one that will appear in printed form for the foreseeable future. However, all the important information will continue to be available and its ending for now will give the Benefice and a future new Minister a clearer picture of the best way to communicate news about the church.

Speaking of a new Minister; I will be leaving after Easter this coming year, and Janet shortly before Easter. These endings to our ministries will bring new challenges, but will open up possibilities for new ministries in the future. You might take up the call to train as a worship leader and discover a gift you had never before considered. As a Benefice you may work

together in new ways and make new plans for how future ministry may work here.

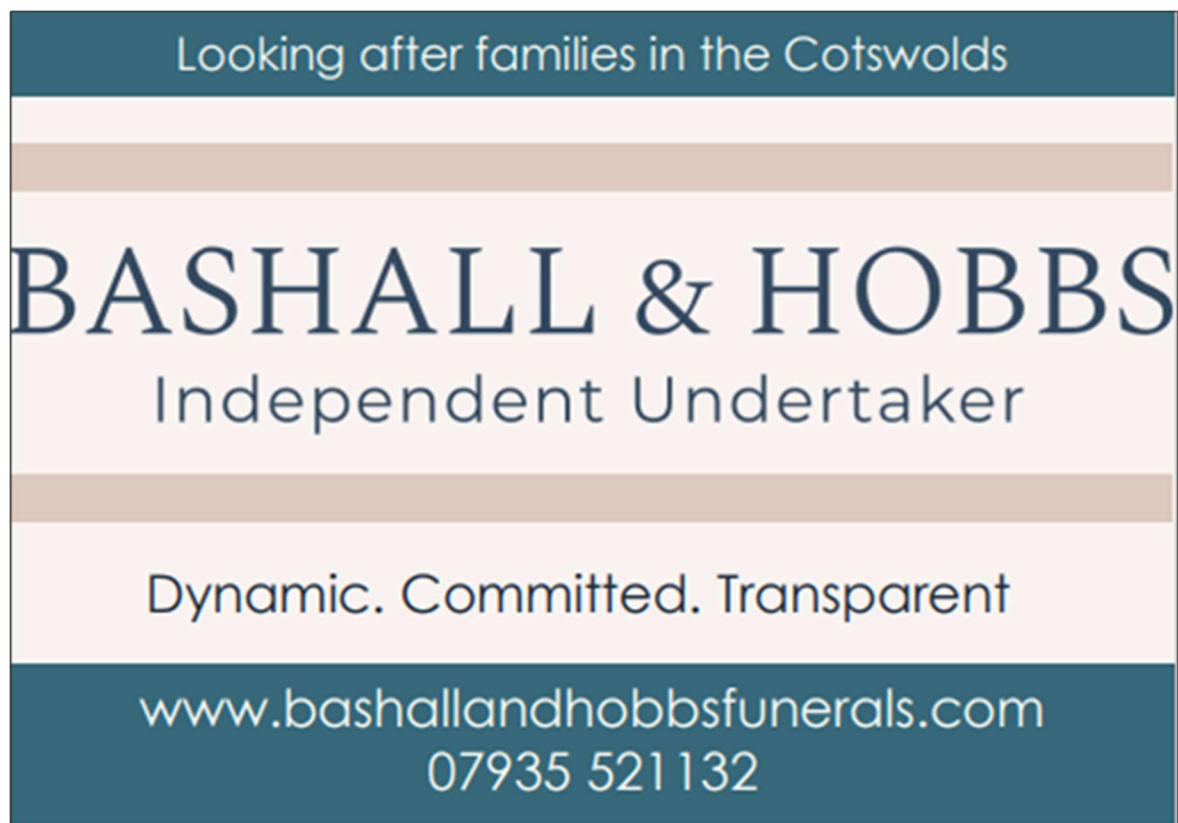
Endings can make us a bit anxious, but that is because we are comfortable with the familiar. Challenges, and also creativity come when new things happen.

At Christmas we celebrate God doing a new thing – God is fond of new things: “Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.” says God through the prophet Isaiah.

The new thing we celebrate at Christmas is the incarnation of God in the flesh of Christ. Until now God had relied on words and prophets to make him known, now Jesus would reveal God in a new and glorious way. The extraordinary truth of Christmas is that God has showed up – and now walks with us.

The world at the moment is complex and perplexing, full of things we would like to see end, in the hope that the new thing will be better. Peace instead of war, mutual understanding instead of suspicion, and love instead of anger and hate. God longs to guide us to the new thing, and we can enter into the year ahead with confidence knowing that God – the God who shows up – is walking with us. That’s why we celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas; a birth that is so important that it was announced by angels, sought out by wise men and still celebrated 2 thousand years later. There will be carols and celebrations in our churches along the Churn Valley over the Christmas period. We would love to welcome you if you would come and join us to celebrate God’s new thing.

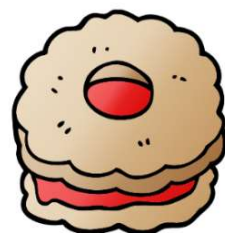
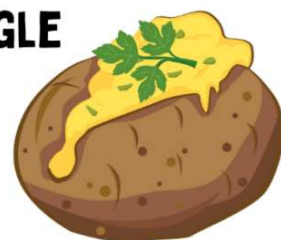

D-Day 80th Anniversary Commemorated in “The Longest Yarn” - Jan Moore

D-Day 80th Anniversary Commemorated in “The Longest Yarn” comes to Tewkesbury Abbey – December/January

The Longest Yarn is a 100% knitted 80m 3D depiction of 6 June 1944: a work of art which will eventually be displayed permanently only a few miles from The Bayeux Tapestry and become a long term stunning record of another piece of history.

80 scenes, each measuring one metre in length display the world’s largest amphibious invasion. The Longest Yarn is something quite unique and not to be missed. The scenes include the build-up to D-Day in England, the horrors on the Landing Beaches and the Bloody Inland Battles. Guidance from professional historians has supported the scenes which have been selected by the creators to depict the accurate story of that momentous day. Some of the scenes present actual WW2 veterans that were in the theatre of war in Normandy on 6th June, and others present the lesser known events in local towns and villages in Normandy.

180 knitters from across the world, including the UK, USA, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, France and even people with NATO stationed in Europe, have joined in to help make this project happen.

Tansy Foster, an English resident of Carentan, who came up with the idea and has coordinated the project said:

“One of my favourite scenes is the depiction of the famous moment when Lord Lovat and Piper Bill Millin crossed Pegasus Bridge, and another is when Bill plays his pipes on Sword Beach. Piper Millin’s son donated his father’s favourite jumper to us which we unravelled (frogged) and used to knit the figures of Piper Bill – it’s given a real poignancy to these scenes”

An accompanying book will be on sale, giving more information on each of the 80 scenes, including a photo of each one taken in 1944 to show viewers what each scene was based on.

There is no charge for entry but donations are invited- suggested at £5 per person. Tickets are not needed.

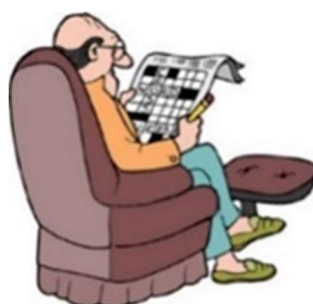

News from the Diocese

A message from Bishop Rachel and Bishop Robert issued on 15th November 2024.

For clergy, lay leaders and worshipping communities across the Diocese of Gloucester

We are acutely aware that this past week in the life of the Church of England has been turbulent and painful, particularly for victims and survivors of abuse, who must remain front and centre in our thoughts, actions and prayers. As you know from our statement we believe that the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been the right thing, whilst recognising this has resulted in further turbulence.

Please be assured that all the right safeguarding processes are being followed regarding people in this diocese related to the content and findings of the Makin report.

The letter linked below from Bishop Joanne Grenfell, the Lead Bishop for Safeguarding, not only outlines some key information but also helpfully reminds us of the journey we have been on regarding safeguarding, not least the current work being done in response to the Jay Report regarding independence. The meeting of General Synod in February 2025 will be significant in taking this forward.

Many of you will recall that this Diocese had our independent INEQ audit earlier this year and the audit found “a strong and tangible focus on safeguarding with a clear leadership commitment to create and support a culture that enables everyone engaged with and by the church to flourish”. That does not mean we should be complacent but we do hope it offers confidence in all that we are endeavouring to live together. As we approach Safeguarding Sunday (17 November) it is important for us all to renew our commitment and understanding that safeguarding is the responsibility of every one of us, not only in our worshipping communities but in our daily lives. It is about how we live the truth that every person is

created in the image of God, and our desire to live and share the transforming love revealed in Jesus Christ. Furthermore, it is about a commitment to shining the light of Christ in dark places and bringing to light the brokenness that too often remains hidden.

We want to thank our superb diocesan safeguarding team, led by Brett Riches, and pay tribute to their wisdom, support and care, particularly in their response to victims and survivors. We also want to express our deep thanks to all those people who voluntarily live out the role of Parish Safeguarding Officer (PSO) across the diocese. We also want to acknowledge that in a week when there has been so much focus on Archbishops and bishops, that the life of the Church is primarily what is being lived out at the local level and across so many different contexts of our diocese, and in so many different ways. We are saddened that the events of this week will have placed additional pressure on you, not least emotionally, and we are aware that trust and integrity has been brought into question. We want to express our heartfelt thanks to you for your ministry and your commitment to live and share the good news of Jesus Christ. It is a privilege to share in ministry with you.

It is our hope and prayer that as we all continue to reflect, that we will stay rooted and grounded in the one who brings life out of death, and that we will renew our commitment to live and share Christ's life in all its fullness among the people and places of our daily lives as disciples of Jesus Christ.

We end by referring to Psalm 23, familiar to so many in places of celebration and sorrow. It is a good place to pause, pray and reflect.
